SPEAKER: Mia Geisinger, D.D.S., M.S.

TOPIC: "The Effects of Periodontal Disease"

Dr. Geisinger is an assistant professor in the Department of Periodontology and Periodontal Predoctoral Program Director at the University of Alabama School of Dentistry. She received her D.D.S. from Columbia University School of Dental Medicine and completed her Certificate in Periodontics and Implantology and her Masters of Science degree at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. She is a diplomate of the American Board of Periodontology. Prior to joining the UAB faculty in 2007, she worked in a private practice limited to periodontology in Goodlettsville, TN. She is the 2009 recipient of the AADR William Clark Fellowship Award and the American Board of Periodontology Foundation Teaching Fellowship. She has lectured nationally and internationally on periodontology and periodontal education. Dr. Geisinger's clinical practice includes all aspects of periodontology and implant dentistry and focuses on root coverage and aesthetic procedures as well as the links between systemic disease and periodontal inflammation. Her lecture will make you more aware of the increasing numbers of systemic medical conditions and the myriad interactions between periodontal inflammation and systemic diseases and more able to educate your patients about these interactions.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Positive Directions!



On two fronts, we seem to be headed in a more positive direction. First, dentistry in Alabama is once again beginning to come together more cohesively and cooperatively. Second, our own Birmingham District Dental Society is working diligently towards improving as we closely examine and address our financial situation.

At the last Board of Dental Examiners (BDE) open forum, the BDE asked the Alabama Dental Association (ALDA) to form a special committee to study and make recommendations addressing the "access to care" issue. As dentists, we are aware that the concept of Mid-Level Providers is being studied and utilized by other states. We, in Alabama, feel that public safety should be a primary concern and that Mid-Level Providers, and even aggressive expanded auxiliaries, could lead to a two-tiered quality of care instead of truly accessing dental access.

Many years ago, the dentists of our state worked together to design the Alabama Dental Hygiene Program (ADHP), a concept that remains unique to our state, but one that successfully addressed the shortage of dental hygiene providers. Our state should be proud of the action we have already taken and stand on the fact that we have already addressed "access to care" on a large scale. Under this program, many rural area dentists have trained hygienists from their local population. Because of this, a positive impact in the area of prevention has occurred through more dental cleanings in under-served areas. This is a significant model that we can and should actively promote for other states to follow. In



addition, there are other avenues to pursue, such as mobile dental units in the truly under-served areas. It is good to see ALDA and the BDE again looking to work together to come up with recommendations which are safe for the public..

Locally, the BDDS Executive Council is addressing the realities this economy has caused our local organization, like many other organizations and businesses, to face. Dr. Gerry Walker, BDDS treasurer, will be informing the society about our financial situation at the next meeting. November 9. We are encouraging suggestions from our members as we look for ways to stop the annual loss we have been experiencing. One way we are making changes is to look at ways we can cut expenses. This year, the Executive Council cut one expense by not spending as much money on the traditional dinner at our first meeting. This is just a small step since our expenses exceed our income. We will also need to look at other ways to be more efficient.

Another way we are making changes is by encouraging better attendance at our Friday meetings by inviting high quality speakers. Last month, Dr. DeWitt Wilkerson from the Dawson Academy spoke. Although this was our first attempt at this, the results are very encouraging. Not only did we make a profit, but all surveyed asked that we complete the series by having two more programs. Although these speakers are more expensive, the attendees felt that this high quality course was a great value, and we netted a greater profit than we typically net.


