SPEAKER: Keith Kinderknecht, D.M.D., F.A.C.P.

TOPIC: "TMD - A Practical Screening Process"

Dr. Kinderknecht is a professor in the Department of Prosthodontics and Director of Advanced Education in Prosthodontics at the University of Alabama School of Dentistry. He received his D.M.D. with distinction from the University of Kentucky in 1971 and a certificate in prosthodontics with distinction from the National Naval Dental Center in Bethesda, MD. He is a diplomate of the American Board of Prosthodontics and a Fellow of the American College of Prosthodontics. He has been working in the areas of dental occlusion and articulation, mandibular movement, and TMD for more than 40 years. He is past chair of the American Alliance of TMD Organizations, consultant to the Graduate Prosthodontic Program at the National Naval Dental Center, and a member of the American Equilibration Society. He was named outstanding faculty member at the Oral Roberts University School of Dentistry in 1979 and placed first in the John J. Sharry Prosthodontic Research Competition in 1991. You will learn what TMD is, its Epidemiology, the medico-legal aspects of TMD and how to screen for it..




## President's Message



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## **Mission Opportunity**



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
